A. GENERAL (S) During the first eight days of March, BLF 3/26 was involved in Operation Taylor Cordon and was operating in the "Arizona Territory" A.O. west of An Hoa combat base. The majority of enemy activity during this period was located in the southern half of the A.O. and three companies (India, Kilo, and Mike) were designated to move into this area on a search and destroy mission, while Lima Company remained as C.P. security. All three sweep companies found themselves in heavy contact as they moved further to the south. The reason for the enemy's tenacity soon became apparent as approximately 20 rocket, mortar and recoilless rifle sites were found in position which allowed them to fire, line of sight, on An Hoa combat base. From the quantity of ammunition found, both small arms and mortars and recoilless rifle, it became obvious that the NVA force was withdrawing rapidly in front of the BLF.

On 08 March 1969, Operation Taylor Cordon came to an official close. The BLF's record for the operation was 295 VC/NVA KIA and 27 POW's with 33 Logistic KIA and 149 Wounding HI.

From the eighth through the twenty-second of March, the BLF continued its mission in the Arizona A.O. concentrating on the southern half of the A.O. On the Thirtieth, the D-F Co. along with the C-H Platoon displaced to a position closer to the companies in the lowlands. The companies retained fairly static positions and conducted patrols and sweeps to secure this area of the A.O.

Contact during this period was limited to small scale ambush and night probes supported by mortars and recoilless rifles with one exception on the seventeenth. Five Company, while moving to its BCB came under intense small arms and mortar fire from an estimated NVA company in prepared positions in a U-shape approximately 700 meters in width. Air strikes, artillery and CIAs were called in on the area which resulted in numerous casualties for the enemy as evidenced by the quantities of blood, bullet fragments, weapons and 7.2 gear found the next day by patrols into the area.

On the twentieth, Lima Company initiated a flip-flop between 2/5 Marine and BLF 3/26 in a helicopter movement which lifted them to An Hoa combat base. The balance of the BLF followed on the twenty-second of March.

On 23 March 1969, the D-F along with "C" Btry 1/13 and "J" Btry 1/6 were dropped from Open 5th Marines to Open 7th Marines and moved by convoy to Camp Phuoc and a several day rehook period.

On 31 March 1969, the BLF helilifted into the "Charlie Ridge / Piggy Valley" area to commence Operation "Oldham Hill" along with units of the 7th Marines and 51st ARVN's.

B. ADMINISTRATION (S) During the period 1-23 March 1969, the BLF's administration room was located at An Hoa combat base; battalion supply was located at BIC in DaNang. From 23-31 March 1969, the administration work was located in Camp Phuoc, Hill 55. 4th Battalion HQ still located at Hill DaNang.

11 April 1969C. Environment (S)

1. Enemy Situation: Enemy forces in the RVN 3/26 "Defiant Measure" Paylon Corner" Arizone A.O. were estimated at 1100-1200 VC/PA. This figure was based upon 7 NVA battalions and 2 local forced battalions. The 60th, 70th and 80th battalions of the 2nd NVA regiment, the Support battalion and the 1st Communications company.

2. Enemy Mission: The mission of the enemy in the Arizone A.O. was to harass allied forces in and around An Non and to support rocket attacks on An Non combat base. The enemy began the post-EM offensive; the major targets during this period were large cities, provincial capitals and allied military bases. Due to the Paris peace talks the enemy was expected to protect his EM offensive in order to reap maximum propaganda benefits.

3. Weather: The mean temperature was 77 degrees, with an average high of 83 degrees and low of 66 degrees. The relative humidity was 77% and precipitation totaled 1 inch. The winds were variable at an average of 8-10 knots.

4. Terrain: The terrain encountered was primarily dry rice paddies, some of which had been double cropped. There were areas that were overgrown with thick woods, brush and elephant grass. Soils in the area consisted of sand along the rivers, hard packed clay and dirt in the paddy areas and solid rock in the mountainous and ridge areas. The entire A.O. had two lines that were generally around the villages and separating the rice paddies. Dominant features within the Arizone A.O. were: Hill 65 to the north, the Song Vu Gia river and the Song Mu Ben river that borders the A.O., a mountain range to the west and a ridge line that runs from the west to east in the center of the A.O.

5. Avenues of Approach: In the Arizone A.O., the avenues of approach afforded the enemy were the Song Vu Gia river valley in the northwestern portion of the A.O. and the Song Mu Ben river valley in the southeastern portion of the A.O. Limited access was afforded the enemy by the mountains in the western and southwestern portion of the A.O.

D. Civil Actions (U) The only civil affairs conducted in the Arizone A.O. were to those people within the A.O. who needed medical attention.

E. Psychological Operations (C) None were conducted of locals.

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F. Fire Support. (3) During this period supporting arms were used extensively in all aspects of the operation. Special emphasis was given to day and night NVA fires. Whistler Battery 1/13 and Charrlie Battery were used in direct support while 2/11 was in general support. Reinforcing fires were fired by Mike Battery 4/13, Tango Battery 2/11 3rd 155 Platoon and 3rd 8" Platoon.

G. Air Support. (3)

(1) Air support was requested by the battalion AC/AIO through 5th Marines.

(2) During the month of March:

- a. 65 Helovans were called.
- b. 22 EP's were run on enemy positions.
- c. 50 a/c strikes were run on enemy positions.
- d. 7 missions were run by Spooky gunships, on enemy positions.
- e. 7 Over-flights of the A.O. were utilized.

H. Logistics. (3)

(1) Logistic support was satisfactory. Transportation during this period was provided by helicopters operating from An Hoa to field units in the An Lao area and to road units in Da Nang. Transportation for supplies located at Da Nang to An Hoa was provided by this unit.

(2) Maintenance support was provided by normal Marine Corps support facilities. Administrative and communications equipment was inspected and repaired by an office machinery and communications equipment repair team sent by 1st MA.

I. Communications. (3)

1. Message Center. The 5th Marine Regiment maintained the communications and crypto guard, with courier delivery and pick-up provided by the BMF 3/26 message center. Upon arrival at Hill 55 on 23 March 69 the 7th Marine Regiment assumed the communications and crypto guard, with BMF 3/26 providing courier service for picking up and delivery.

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2. Radio. All functional and tactical radio nets were guarded at the BLF C.P. A relay station was positioned on Hill 55 by SLB Bravo from 8 March 1969 until 29 March 1969. The BLF worn C.R. guarded the SLB TAC #1 covered until 29 March 1969, of which time the JE radio communications was used on TAC #1 with no covered capabilities. Upon arriving at Hill 55 functional and tactical nets were established as required. On 29 March 1969 ANNN net was established with SLB Bravo. On 29 March 1969, a four (4) man radio team was sent to RG DA III to establish a relay site for the BLF TAC #2 and BLF logistics net in preparation for operation "Okinawa Hills".

3. Wire/relay Relays. Normal internal wire lines were established in the rear C.P. at An Hoa with two lines to 5th Marine Regiment and one to 2/5. No radio relay was employed. Upon arrival at Hill 55 normal internal wire communications was established with two lines to 7th Marine Regiment. On 30 March 1969 a hot line was installed from DIA 3/26 CSC to 7th Marine Regiment CSC.

4. Radio Repair. Radio repair was done at the rear C.P. up to 2nd echelon. All other was done at P.R.

J. Medical-Dental (C)

1. Personnel. The Battalion Aid Station has a total of 58 personnel, consisting of 6 corporal in a Moderate status, 50 effective corporal, and 2 medical officers. In addition, 14 corporals were detached from supporting units.

2. Capabilites. The medical department is capable of treating all medical and some surgical problems. The capabilities are limited since there was no running water, nor availability of diagnostic tests. Daily runs were made to 1st Med-Bn and HMA Hospital for consultations. Seriously wounded or ill individuals were taken to Da Nang for immediate and capable treatment.

3. Training. Corporal in garrison received on-the-job training directly from the medical officer. Corporal in the field carried out their own lectures on first aid, buddy aid and field sanitation.

4. Dental. Treatment on Hill 55 was available, but only in emergencies. Extensive dental work was arranged for at HMC and Da Nang. Some dental problems were worked on by BLF Dental Officer at USM Valley Forge.

5. Malaria Prophylaxis. Was supervised by the medical department.

6. Sanitation. Shower facilities were available as were 2 four holes and 4 urinals. Daily cleaning was accomplished in each of these facilities on Hill 55.

BL I while conducting a search was taken under fire, with 3.0" ChiCom's, machine gun and sniper fire, resulting in 03 USMC KIA and 06 USMC WIA. BL India returned fire with all organic weapons and called in gunships and arty on enemy grids. Negative Results.

BL K-2 received fire from 06 NVA. BL K returned fire with S/A and called in arty on enemy positions. Negative Results.



Subj: Combat Operations After Action Report

1. Forwarded.
2. Concur with recommendation 18a. The Arizona Area is too large to be effectively controlled by one battalion; however, additional forces were not available.
3. With regard to recommendation 18b, it would have been desirable to maintain all BLT supporting arms (4.2 Inch Mortar and 105mm Howitzer) at one centrally located FSB in the Arizona. However, this would have resulted in one entire company providing security for the FSB, leaving only three maneuver companies. The tactical situation at the time would not allow for this.

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(1) During both operations, the BLT was directly supported by "W" Btry 1/13 and "O" Btry 1/13. 2/11 was in general support with reinforcing fires fired by "K" Btry 4/13, "P" Btry 2/11, 33rd 155MM Platoon, and the 3rd 8" Platoon.

(2) H&I targets were selected on the basis of nap reconnaissance, intelligence reports and positions of previous contact. H&I's were fired in an irregular pattern throughout day and night.

(3) Fires conducted of major importance:

(a) Prop Fires	(147)
(b) TOT's	(93)
(c) Precision Destruction	(6)

b. Air Support

(1) Air support was requested by the BLT FAC/AAC through 5th Marines.

(2) During the period 10 Feb - 23 Mar 1969:

- (a) 103 Medevacs were called.
- (b) 1758 Troops were heli-lifted for tactical deployment.
- (c) 27 Databees were heli-lifted to An Hoa combat base.
- (d) 22 TPQ's were run on enemy positions.
- (e) 73 Air strikes were run on enemy positions.
- (f) 7 Over-flights of the A.O. were utilized.

8. INTELLIGENCE

a. The enemy forces during both operations in the Arizona A.O. were estimated at 1100-1200 VC/NVA. This figure was based upon 3 NVA battalions and 2 local force battalions. There were also four (4) units of unknown size and origin operating within the A.O.; the 60th, 70th and 80th battalions of the 21st NVA regiment, the 3rd Seppa battalion and the 1st Communications company.

b. Enemy Mission

The mission of the enemy in the Arizona A.O. was to harass allied forces in and around An Hoa and to support rocket attacks on An Hoa combat base. The enemy began the post-TET offensive; the major targets during this period were large cities, provincial capitals, and all military bases. Due to the Paris peace talks the enemy was expected to protract his TET offensive in order to achieve maximum propaganda benefits.

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6 May 1969c. Weather

The mean temperature was 77 degrees, with an average high of 83 degrees and an average low of 66 degrees. The relative humidity was 77% and precipitation totaled 1 inch. The winds were variable at an average of 8-10 knots.

d. Terrain

The terrain encountered was primarily dry rice paddy, some of which had been double cropped. There were areas that were over-grown with thick woods, brush and elephant grass. Soils in the area consisted of sand along the rivers, hard packed clay and dirt in the paddy areas and solid rock in the mountainous and ridge areas. The entire A.O. had tree lines that were generally around the villages and separating the rice paddies. Dominant features within the Arizona A.O. were: Hill 65 to the north, the Song Vu Gia river and the Song Thu Bon river that border the A.O., a mountain range to the west and a ridge line that runs from the west to east in the center of the A.O.

e. Avenues of Approach

In the Arizona A.O., the avenues of approach afforded the enemy were the Song Vu Gia river valley in the north-western portion of the A.O. and the Song Thu Bon river valley in the south-eastern portion of the A.O. Limited access was afforded the enemy by the mountains in the western and southwestern portion of the A.O.

9. CIVIC ACTION

The only civic action conducted in the Arizona A.O. was to those people within the A.O. who needed medical attention.

10. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

Psyops were conducted in the form of leaflet drops throughout the A.O. prior to II-Hour.

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6 May 1969**11. MISSION**

Commencing at 1-Hour on D-Day, BLT 3/26 (-) (Rein) conducts an helicopter-borne assault into an assigned AOA in the Arizona Territory to establish a FSB and conducts offensive operations to find, fix and destroy enemy forces, equipment and installations.

12. CONCEPT OF OPERATION

BLT 3/26 (-) (Rein) lands with three rifle companies in LZ AT 900556 and establishes defensive perimeter. The remainder of BLT 3/26 lands on D+1. On order conducts search, clear and destroy operations to the west, establishes FSB vicinity (AT 823535) and continues mission in AOA.

13. EXECUTION

With the issuance of 5th Marines Warning Order 2-69 BLT 3/26 commenced Operation "Defiant Iceni/Taylor Common" and an Unnamed operation. The following is a chronological listing of significant events.

10 Feb 69

0900 BLT 3/26 was helilifted into the "Arizona Territory". C.P. was established at vicinity 825530. Commenced to search and clear immediate area with India, Kilo, Lima and Mike companies. 1320H Kilo found body killed by shrapnel; checked body for documents with negative results. Results 01 VC KIA.

11 Feb 69

0015H Mike company Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap placed along hedge row. Results 01 USMC KIA and 01 USMC med-evac. 1100H Kilo-1 stroll came across 05 VC. Took under fire with S/A. Results 02 VC POU. 1115H Kilo-1 made contact with a small number of VC. VC broke contact. Results 01 USMC med-evac. 1115H Marine from India-2 tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Trap was set up in elephant grass, not on trail. Results 01 USMC med-evac. 1210H India-1 found 04 Vietnamese hiding in a hole with 02 bags of gear and 01 bag of AK-47 rounds. Results 04 POW's sent to rear. 1340H Mike-2 Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Results 01 USMC med-evac. 1345H India-2 Marine tripped booby trapped M-26 grenade. Results 02 USMC med-evac. 1347H India-2 tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Results 02 USMC med-evac. 1500H Kilo came under .50 cal fire. Fire was coming from ARVN's position across river. Liaison was made to cease fire. ARVN's stated they had 07 Chieu Hoi's, 05 of which were wounded. Chieu Hoi's crossed river from our A.O. to ARVN A.O.

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1108 Kilo-1 found rocket pod dropped from chopper with 19 rockets still attached. Marked and notified DO. 1135H Mike-3 Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Marine heard click of grenade and gave quick warning. Results 01 USMC WIAE. 1345H Mike company Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap concealed in hedge row. Results engineers blew in place. 1025H Mike company resupply birds took intense small arms fire from enemy. Called in gun ships and laid down suppressing fires. Resulting in a complete resupply. 2123H India company resupply birds received intense enemy fire. 01 helicopter was hit and forced to land. India returned fire to enemy positions with S/A and 60MM. Results 01 USMC med-evacuated. 2200H Mike company killer team spotted 20 VC moving in a southerly direction killer team sprung ambush. Results 03 VC KIA.

13 Feb 69

0245H India company was moving toward downed bird and came under fire from snipers. Returned fire with S/A and M-79's. Results 03 USMC WIAE. 0355H India arrived at downed bird. Secured area around bird, set up a defensive position. 1545H Mike company while on sweep of a village came under heavy fire from trench line and bunker complex. Spotted 10-12 VC fleeing to the north. Commenced firing S/A and M-79's. Proceeded to assault enemy positions. Results 01 USMC WIAE, 05 VC KIA. 02 AK-47's magazines and amio and two ChiComs. 1705H Mike company received incoming 60MM rounds. Resulting 03 USMC WIAE, med-evacuated. 2040H Mike company received incoming ChiComs into their lines. Returned fire with S/A and M-79's. Results 01 USMC WIAE. 2055H EOD team checked out reported rocket pod by Kilo company. Blew in place along with a 750 lb bomb and 02 rounds.

14 Feb 69

0315H India received S/A fire and ChiComs. Returned fire with S/A and M-79's. Called in arty mission. Results 01 WIAE. 0600H India took 03 M-79 rounds into their position. Returned fire with M-79's. Results 01 USMC med-evacuated. 0600-1700 Kilo and India companies continuing sweep came across a number of bunkers and dug rounds. Bunkers and rounds were blown in place by engineers. 1725H India received 04 incoming 60MM rounds. Called in arty mission and 60MM's. Results 01 USMC WIAE.

15 Feb 69

0600H Throughout the night all companies received harassing fire from the enemy. Results no casualties. 1000H Mike company called an air strike on 02 large enemy bunkers and 05 structures. 02 secondary explosions were observed.

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1300H Mike company stroll spotted 03 NVA digging in along tree line. Took under fire with S/A, M-79's and 60MM's. Enemy returned fire with 30 cal machine gun fire and AK-47 fire. Results 01 USMC KIA 03 USMC WIA, 04 NVA KIA. 1340H India while on sweep to objective "E" received 02 incoming M-79 rounds. Returned fire with M-79's and 3.5 rockets. Results 02 USMC WIA. 1445H AO on station spotted 04 NVA in open rice paddy. AO Strafed NVA with 04 NVA KIA confirmed. 1500H Mike company searching area where air strikes were run earlier found 04 NVA KIA. Results 04 NVA KIA. 1615H India company making a detailed search of area uncovered a large cache of polished rice totaling 22 100 lbs bags of rice. 1900-160600H companies received harassing fires and probes. No casualties.

16 Feb 69

0800H India company continuing a search found large enemy cache consisting of 4,100 lbs of rice, 01 ChiCom, 01 NVA canteen, 01 can of cosmoline, 06 NVA belts with star insignias, 01 portable radio, clothing digging tools, 06 belts of black silk, 01 belt of shark skin cloth, and AK-47 ammo. 1000H Lima company stroll found 05 82MM rounds. Rounds were sent to company C.P. Engineers blew. 1030H Mike company spotted 02 VC hiding in bushes approximately 75 meters from their position. VC were observing Mike's lines. Stroll was sent out. Results 02 VC POW's. 1210H Lima-2 spotted 1 VC setting booby trap. Lima-3 tried to capture VC but he resisted and fled. Results 01 VC KIA. 1215H Lima-1 Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Results no casualties. 1335H Mike company spotted 01 VC who was wounded badly. Med-evacued to rear. Results 01 POW. 1400H Mike-2 while searching area found 06 fresh graves. Graves were dug up and 06 25-30 yr old males in black clothing were discovered. Results 06 VC KIA. 1730H Mike company with AO on station observed several NVA running into bunker complex. Air strike was called and 250 & 500 lb bombs employed on bunkers. 01 small secondary and 01 large secondary explosion were observed. 1840H Mike-3 observed 01 VC hiding in a rice paddy. Opened fire with S/A and M-79's. AO on station observed fire and made a strafing run. Resulting in 01 VC KIA.

17 Feb 69

0900H Mike company checking area where air strike was run on bunker complex found 04 NVA KIA. Results 04 NVA KIA. 1200 Lima company while setting in 60MM's, 01 Marine tripped 105 Booby trap. Results 01 USMC med-evacued. 1315H Lima company found 04 booby traps rigged with 60MM WP rounds and 01 rigged with 105 round. Engineers blew all booby traps in place.

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0930H Lima company received S/A fire. A0 was on station and called in fixed wing air strikes. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1115H Lima company received S/A and automatic weapons fire. Returned fire with S/A machine guns and called 81MM mission. Results 01 USMC KIA, 01 USMC WIAE. 1140H India-2 while sweeping area where they previously received sniper fire found 01 Vietnamese, thought to be V.C. Sent to the rear to S-2. Results 01 VC suspect. 1215H Mike company spotted 03 VC suspects attempting to draw Mike-3 into ambush. Interpreter was convinced suspects were part of VC infrastructure. Suspects sent to S-2 in rear. Results 03 VC POW's. 1220H Mike company with A0 on station observed 04 NVA running from area. A0 made 03 strafing runs on the fleeing enemy. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1500H India-2 stroll spotted 08 NVA wearing flight jackets, helmets with patches and weapons. Opened fire and engaged in fire fight. Resulting in 02 USMC WIA. 1700H Lima-3 sweeping area efflassigned A.O. found 02 NVA KIA. Many died of wounds resulting from 81MM mission. Results 02 NVA KIA. 1845H Mike company received heavy AK fire, H-79's and 60 mortar fire. Returned fire with S/A, H-79's machine guns, 60MM's and called 81MM mission. Results 04 USMC WIAE, 01 NVA KIA.

19 Feb 69

0920H India-1 while awaiting med-evac chopper received sniper fire. Returned fire with 60MM's. Results 01 USMC WIAE. 1230H Lima-2 received heavy S/A fire, H-79's rounds and automatic weapons fire. Returned fire with S/A and called arty mission. Results 07 USMC WIA, 02 NVA KIA. 1845H Mike-2 spotted 01 NVA coming into lines with hands in the air. NVA stated he wanted to Chieu Hoi. Results 01 NVA POW. 2020H India-2 Killer team received 02 rounds incoming 82MM's. Returned fire with 82MM mission. Results 02 USMC WIAE.

20 Feb 69

0900H Lima company while sweeping area found 01 NVA body. NVA apparently killed by arty. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1015H India company received incoming H-79's. Resulting in 01 USMC WIAE. 1225H Lima-1 while sweeping found 02 fresh graves with 02 bodies. Persons were males approx 20 yrs old. Cause of death was by shrapnel and napalm. Results 02 NVA KIA. 1400H India company exploded 01 dud bomb which produced 03 secondary. Resulting in 02 USMC WIAE.

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21 Feb 69

0015H India company received 05 incoming ChiCom grenades. Returned fire with S/A. Resulting 03 USMC WIA. 0920H India company on a sweep made contact with undetermined number of enemy troops. Called 01 HMMI mission. Enemy broke contact leaving 02 NVA helmets and packs behind. 1120H India-2 received S/A fire and M-79 rounds from 05 NVA. Returned fire and called arty mission. Search of enemy area produced 03 NVA packs. 1130H Recon platoon had 01 NVA Chieu Hoi at their position. Returned to S-2. Results 01 NVA POW. 1600H Mike-3 while on stroll spotted 10 NVA dressed in khaki and carrying weapons grouped around a well. Called in arty mission which was on target observed 04 NVA being blown into the air, the rest retreated into tree line. Results 04 NVA KIA. 1800H India company while setting into a night position found 5,500 lbs of rice. Result 5,500 lbs of rice sent to rear. 2035H Mike Killer Team observed 10-15 NVA moving toward their position. NVA had a 03 man point out which walked directly into the killing zone. Killer Team engaged with 02 claymores and small arms. Enemy broke contact. Results 05 NVA KIA.

22 Feb 69

0930K Lime company received 03 round incoming 82MM's. 01 HMMI and arty were called on suspected enemy positions. Result 01 USMC KIA. 1300H India company relieved Kilo company as C.P. security. Kilo company moved out on a sweep to the northeast.

23 Feb 69

0415H Undetermined number of VC penetrated India company's lines into the HM C.P. area. Hand to hand combat resulted in a quick brief struggle. Enemy broke contact and fled. Results 01 USMC KIA 04 USMC WIA, 05 NVA KIA. 60 rounds of ChiCom grenades captured. 0830H Kilo company while swooping through tree line tripped booby trap set with ChiCom grenade. Results 03 USMC WIA. 1030H Kilo company found 01 105 and booby trapped with trip wire. Engineers blow in place. 1145H Lime company received 02 105 MM rounds and both produced an air burst. Called in 01 HMMI mission on suspected enemy positions. Results neg casualties. 1200H Kilo company went stroll to suspected enemy position where Lime received incoming 105 rounds. Found launching site in an old 250 pound bomb crater with a platform. Bombs were launched by an explosive charge of some type. 1430H Lime company Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Results 01 USMC WIA. 1800 - 2300H Kilo and Lime company received harassing fires and small probes throughout the night. Resulting in no casualties.

24 Feb 69

1030H Mike-3 while on patrol observed 02 NVA hiding in a bunker. Engaged with small arms, NVA returned fire with AK and M-79's. Neg results.

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1200H Nike company again made contact with NVA seen earlier. Called in arty mission and air strikes. Results 01 USMC WIA, 01 NVA KIA. 1300H Lima company came across villager who pointed out 02 60MM booby traps. Villager was paid 500 piasters. Engineers blew booby traps in place. 1405H Kilo-2 while on patrol spotted 01 NVA running towards tunnel. Kilo-2 threw 01 M-26 grenade into tunnel. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1630H Lima company received 01 incoming 105 round. Round was an airburst. Results negative casualties. 1700H Nike company's resupply chopper dropped its load outside of lines. Reason for ditching load was unknown. Kilo-2 moved out to retrieve supplies and ran into 05 NVA. Exchanged fire with enemy who broke contact. All supplies but 03 cases of chow was retrieved. Results negative casualties. 2100H Nike company moved out in a night move south towards Kilo's position. Kilo was receiving incoming ChiComs and automatic fire. Nike company's move concerning four clicks was completed at 0330 without incident.

25 Feb 69

0530H Lima company received S/A fire, ChiCom grenades and RPG rounds continually to 0630. Returned fire with all organic weapons and called in arty and CH-47 mission. Results 01 USMC KIA, 04 USMC WIA. 04 NVA KIA. 1045H Lima company spotted 03 VC crossing rice paddy into tree line. Called arty mission. Results 02 VC KIA. 1820H Nike company setting in for the night received heavy AK-47 fire and 30 .cal machine gun fire. Returned fire with S/A and 60MM's. Results 01 USMC WIA and 01 NVA KIA. 1830H Kilo company received 03 rounds 60MM mortar while completing mid-evening at landing zone. Called arty mission and air strikes. Results 01 USMC WIA and 03 NVA KIA.

26 Feb 69

0750H Kilo company found 01 U.S. anti-tank mine setting half buried on trail inside village. Engineers blew in place. 0855H Kilo company found 01 fresh grave. Above produced 01 NVA in green duffelcoats. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1115H Bn C.P. observed 01 NVA flag flying from bamboo staff on Hill 29, air strike called on hill resulting in several secondary explosions indicating numerous booby traps in that area. Flag was destroyed by A.O.'s mortars. 1015H Lima company received S/A fire and H-79 fire. Called air strike, arty, and CH missions. Results 02 NVA KIA. 1230H Nike-1 spotted 03 NVA moving west across dry stream bed, 01 was a female carrying a AR-15 commando weapon. Nike-1 opened fire. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1615H Nike company received 06 rounds of H-79. Returned fire with H-79's and called arty mission. Results 01 USMC WIA.

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5 May 1969

1300H Lima company while moving in the attack received heavy S/A fire and H-79 rounds. Assaulted enemy position with a frontal assault capturing the enemy position and destroying two A A sites. Enemy broke contact and fled. Called arty, 81MM mortars and air strikes in support. Results 84 NVA KIA, of which 75 were from supporting fires. Friendly casualties 06 USMC KIA 29 USMC WIA. 1600H Lima company had med-evac helicopter come into their position. Helicopter came under fire and was forced to land. Another helicopter arrived and med-evac was completed. Downed helicopter was protected by squad from Lima company. 1045H Mike company received 03 ChiCom grenades. Returned fire with S/A and H-79 fire. Results 01 USMC WIA. 1745H India-3 moved from Bn C.P. area to relative Lima company of responsibility of downed bird. Relieved Lima's squad at 1900 and set up security around downed helicopter.

27 Feb 69

0330H Lima company received 01 RPG round. Called arty mission on suspected enemy launch area. Results 01 USMC WIA. 0530H Lima company received 20 rounds of incoming mortar fire. Called 81MM mission and arty on suspected enemy positions. Results 03 USMC WIA. 0940H Mike while searching area found 3,000 rounds of 5.56 ammo in bandoleers. Ammo was blown by engineers. 1000H Mike-1 tripped M-26 grenade booby trap..Resulting in 03 USMC WIA. 1314 Kilo company while conducting sweep and clear mission received sniper fire. Returned fire with S/A and called arty mission. Results 01 USMC KIA, 02 USMC WIA. 1345H Lima-1 received sniper fire from 03 enemy . Returned fire with S/A and called 81MM mission. Results 01 USMC KIA 01 USMC WIA. 1530H Kilo company started to move to consolidate its lines. The NVA opened fire with automatic weapons from 03 bunkers to their front. Suppressed enemy with small arms fire and called artillery mission and air support. Results 02 USMC KIA, 03 USMC WIA. 1650H A.O. on station for Kilo company observed 01 NVA body in front of their lines. Result 01 NVA KIA. 1800H Kilo sent patrol to bunkers where they received fire from in the A.M. Bunkers were destroyed and 03 NVA KIA were found. Results 03 NVA KIA.

28 Feb 69

0330H Lima company received 30 to 50 rounds of incoming mortars and RPG rounds. Returned fire with all organic weapons. called 81MM mission and "spooky". Results 02 USMC WIA. 0600H Kilo company received 01 RPG round. Called arty mission on suspected enemy position. Results 01 USMC WIA. 0655H Lima company found 01 NVA body with documents, uniform, AK-47 and assorted 762 gear. Weapons and documents turned over to S-2 representative. Results 01 NVA KIA.

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1045H Lima-1 Marine tripped 01 booby trap. Results 01 USMC WIA. 1052H Mike-3 received automatic fire from front and left flank. Returned fire with S/A and M-79's. A.O. on station worked area over with rocket strafing. Result 01 USMC WIA. 1130H Lima-1 found 01 fresh grave less than 48 hours old. Grave produced 01 NVA KIA in uniform. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1355H Lima company Marine tripped M-26 grenade booby trap. Results 01 USMC WIA. 1600H Kilo company while on sweep received S/A fire. Returned fire with S/A's and M-79's. Results 01 NVA KIA. 1630H Kilo company in heavy contact received automatic machine gun fire from 02 positions. Called arty and 01 MI mission. Results 01 USMC KIA. 1700H Mike-3 destroyed 17 bunkers using cratering charges. 01 Female suspect found in one of the bunkers. Female was between 20-25 years of age. Bloody clothing was also found in bunkers. Results 01 Female VC Suspect. 1730H Kilo company moving out with two platoons up and one back came under fire from bunkers located to their left front. 15. ADMINISTRATION

a. Supply. LSA was set up in An Hoa. All resupply was done by helicopters. Assault troops carried a combat load of three days rations in their packs and 500 rounds of 5.56 rifle ammo in addition to four canteens of water.

b. Maintenance. Provided by normal Marine Corps support facilities. Administrative and communications equipment was inspected and repaired by an office machinery and communications equipment repair team sent by 1st FSR.

c. Treatment of Casualties and Evaluation and Hospitalization. The medical department was capable of treating all medical and some surgical problems. The capabilities were limited since there was no running water, nor availability of diagnostic tests. Daily runs were made to 1st Med Bn and IUSA hospital for consultation. Seriously wounded or ill medevacs were taken to DaNang for immediate and capable treatment.

d. Transportation. Provided by helicopters operating from An Hoa to field units in the Arizona area and to rear units in DaNang. Transportation for supplies located at DaNang to An Hoa was provided by this units organic truck platoon.

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Communications(1) Radio

All internal BLT radio nets were established and maintained at the base C.P. A rear C.P. established in 5th Marine Regiment C.P. in An Hoa area maintained radios of Bn TAC #1 and Bn TAC #2. Bn TAC #2 was utilized for admin traffic and passing of casualty reports, spot reports etc. External nets were established with: (A) SLF Bravo on their primary TAC through relay at Hill 55 to ship until 18 Feb 1969. Re-established relay with SLF Bravo on or about 6 March 1969, (B) Audited on TAC #1 covered and TAC #2 uncovered between An Hoa and fire base C.P.

(2) Message Center

Communications and crypto guard was passed to and maintained by Task Force Yankees during this period, with courier delivery and pick-up by the BLT message center and Task Force Yankee.

(3) Wire/Radio Relay

Normal internal wire lines were established in rear C.P. and three external lines installed, one to 2/5 and two to 5th Marine Regiment. No radio relay was established during the operation.

(4) General

Equipment maintenance was performed mostly at the rear C.P. area in An Hoa, with limited maintenance of radio PRC-25 and headphones done in fire base C.P. Evacuation of equipment was managed through use of helicopter through our rear C.P. at An Hoa from all companies and fire base C.P.

(5) Problems and Solutions

The frequency interference from Army units and other friendly units and a lack of additional spare frequencies to change to. Better frequency assignments and more spare frequencies should be assigned to BLT for operational use.

Time allotted between operations was in no way sufficient for complete inspection and rehabilitation of communication gear. This means that problems will accumulate over successive operations and poor condition of communication gear affords less than adequate support of units in the field. At least five days should be allowed between operations for complete rehab of all communication gear.

a. Ground Surveillance Radar PPS-6's were used around the fire base and in several instances gave advanced warning of enemy movement during the hours of darkness.

b. Air - Ground Marking System SOP use of pyrotechnic smoke, air panels and strobe lights.

17. COMMANDERS ANALYSIS

a. Operation "Defiant Measure/Taylor Common" and the Unnamed Operation were conceived to deny the enemy a strategic staging area used in his attacks against An Hoa combat base and Hill 65. The duration of both operations prevented the enemy from mounting large scale offensive operations in the area.

b. In these operations, BTF 3/26 was provided with its first opportunity to meet a large, aggressive, well-trained and equipped NVA unit. The heavy contact achieved served as a proving ground for all of the units and unit leaders. The results built a confidence in the BTF and its supporting arms, as well as high over-all morale and fighting spirit.

c. The net result of these operations was the denial of a previously relative secure strategically located staging area to the enemy. After routing the bulk of the enemy forces in the area, it is felt that at least two battalion size units should continue to conduct sweeping operations throughout the Arizona A.O. in order to keep the enemy from moving freely throughout the area.

18. RECOMMENDATIONS

a. It is felt that the A.O. assigned BTF 3/26 was extremely large and could not effectively be controlled by one (1) battalion. The size of the Arizona area dictates no less than two (2) battalions to effectively control the A.O.

b. When operating in terrain such as the Arizona Territory, the supporting arms organic to the B.T should be maintained at a centralized located FSB. This provides the most effective fire support to the maneuvering elements in addition to a better communication capability, both of which contribute greatly to the combat effectiveness of the BTF.

Basic Organization: Officer A (Lead Organization)

1. ORGANIZATIONa. Army Tank Division B (Intelligence)b. Artillery

(1) Supporting on D-Day, 51st MI Regt (-) conducts coordinated search and destroy operations in S.W. part of A.O. to find, fix and destroy enemy forces.

(2) Artillery, except 1 (Fire Support Platoon)

(3) Art. Art. A, provides fixed fire, and helicopters support as required. Annex 4 (Air Support)

(4) Co 1, 1st Engineers Battalion, except support 7th Marines; improves Route 4 from Hill 69 to Hill 58; performs current engineer tasks to establish FSB (Forward Supply Base) to establish rear supply bases (RSB's)/fire support bases (FSB's) in North-Central Ridge area.

(5) 1st Recon Co conducts intelligence and surveillance operations in the west, north, and northeast portions of the A.O. to discover enemy infiltration and to provide warning of imminent reinforcing A.O.

(6) Co 1 2nd Bn. 1st ARB, except support 7th Marines; conducts reconnaissance and set of basic operations in assigned areas to locate the enemy and his major tank positions.

2. MISSION

On D-Day at 1400Z HHR 5/26 (-) (Rein) lands by helicopter in western Happy Valley, (via ZC 133655), establishing FSB Ironco and conduct reconnaissance in force operations in the northern portion of the Happy Valley Charlie Ridge area to interdict enemy infiltration and exfiltration.

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
